Leopard: Tracks and Signs

- 1. Name the 5 signs we discussed in the lesson.
 - Tracks / Footprints
 - Droppings
 - Spray-urinating and Scraping
 - Tree scratching
 - Visual clues
- 2. How do leopards ensure that their urine smell sticks to their feet so that the scent will be dispersed as they walk?
 - They scrape the area with their feet.
- 3. Give the 2 main reasons why leopards spray-urinate?
 - Mark their territory.
 - Convey messages on their reproductive state.
- 4. When leopards scratch a tree they sharpen their claws and groom them and also send messages to others leopards not only visually but also chemically because of the excretion of a gland in between the toes.
- 5. The pad of a leopard track has <u>three</u> lobes at the back and <u>two</u> lobes in front.
- 6. You will know it is a leopard track because you will see the claw marks. TRUE FALSE
- 7. There is a lot of calcium in digested bones therefore the colour of the droppings/faeces will turn white when exposed to sunlight.
